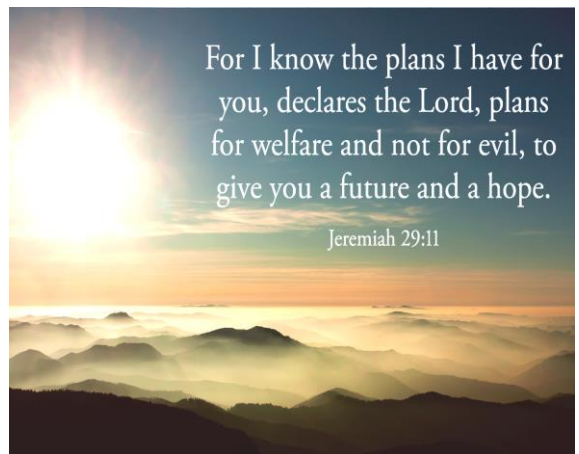

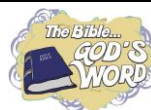
PASTOR'S CORNER

Prayers Every Catholic Child Should Know (cont'd)

An Act of Hope

An Act of Hope is a great prayer for school aged children. Encourage your children to remember it so that they can pray the Act of Hope before taking a test. Studying is a necessity, but it's important for kids to understand that they don't have to rely solely on their own abilities.

An Act of Charity

Children often experience real and imagined insults and pain from peers and classmates during their formative years, a period of intense emotions. While the main purpose of charity is to show God how much we care, this prayer also serves as a daily reminder to our children to learn to forgive and love others

The Act of Contrition

Besides the fact that prayer is necessary for the sacrament of confession, we should also encourage our children to do penance every night before going to bed. Children who have made their first confession should also quickly examine their conscience before repenting.

Grace Before Meals

It might be challenging to instill a sense of appreciation in our children in a world when many individuals have an excess of material belongings. A wonderful method to remind them (and yourself!) that all we have ultimately comes from God is to say grace before meals.

The Guardian Angel Prayer

Children appear prone to believe in their guardian angel, similar to devotion to the Virgin Mary. Early instilling of such conviction will help shield kids from later skepticism. Encourage older kids to pray to their guardian angel on top of the traditional Guardian Angel Prayer.

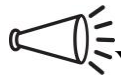
OUTREACH & EVANGELIZATION
