New Church Year!

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent is the season comprising the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas (Sunday, November 28 – Friday, December 24)

Advent is the time of expectation and preparation for the birth of our Lord! The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. It is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth is.

Since circles have no beginning and no end, the circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes eternal life in Christ. The wreath holds four candles which are lit progressively, over the four weeks of the Advent season. Generally, three are violet (purple) and one is rose-colored, each representing 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the Savior.
