The Mass Part three: Meal sharing/Liturgy of the Eucharist/Communion Rite (cont'd).

"Behold the Lamb...: In order to receive Holy Communion, the partakers must first acknowledge their unworthiness and pray for healing. The priest says, "Behold the Lamb of God," and displays the consecrated host to them above the chalice, encouraging them to make this confession of faith. This claim is supported by two biblical scriptures. The priest begins by referencing John the Baptist, who instructs his disciples to gaze upon the Lamb of God (see John 1.29), and then Revelation (19.9), which declares that those who are granted access to the supper of the Lamb are blessed. This text serves as a reminder that those who diligently assemble around the altar of the Lord to receive his Body and Blood during this life will, hopefully, be brought together in the future to partake of the delicious feast provided in the halls of heaven.

"Lord I am not worthy...": The congregation and the priest then both proclaim their unworthiness of receiving such a great Sacrament. This book's origins are in the story of the centurion's slave's recovery (see Matthew 8.8 and Luke 7.6). The biblical expressions "my child" are translated into the liturgical term "my soul" because the community is more interested in a general spiritual cure than a specific physical one.

The Communion Prayer of the Priest: While taking Holy Communion, the priest prays in silence. One of the prayers that go along with receiving Holy Communion is "May the Body/Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life."

The Communion Chant: The congregation sings a hymn before the Communion procession. It begins when the priest receives Holy Communion to link his communion with that of the community as a whole. Songs that are performed at Holy Communion have a lengthy tradition and date all the way back to the fourth century.
