The Mass Part four: The Concluding Rites – Commissioning

The Concluding Rites, or fourth portion of the Mass, include announcements (if any), the final or solemn benediction, the dismissal, the procession, and the recessional chant. The closing rites get us ready to go forth into the world and live the gospel. We get ready to return to the environment where we will be living for the ensuing week. We are aware that the burdens we left outside the church for this Eucharist must now be carried once more, but with the help of this Eucharist and this community.

The Announcements: More than just the Sunday Eucharist is celebrated in a parish community. Announcing the many events and activities taking place in the parish to the congregation can be done before dismissal.

The Final or Solemn Blessing: The priest blesses the crowd before sending them on their way. A blessing is a symbol of God's protection over our life and the upcoming week's plans. It serves as a reminder that God is with us on our life's path. When the deacon asks the congregation to bow their heads and the priest prays a threefold blessing over them, the final blessing takes on a more serious tone on Solemnities.

The Dismissal: The deacon, if present, initiates the Dismissal, the last conversation of the Mass, by sending the congregation out of Mass and into the world. We depart from the gathering and the church structure, but we don't go without something. Our weekly experiences—whether they involve family, helping the less fortunate, or just plain working—give the ritual activities we have celebrated at Mass a richer meaning. The entire significance of the ritual gestures performed at Mass is only understood in relation to our everyday life.
