Sacrament of Matrimony

From man's beginning, marriage was a sacred union. It was God's instrument for the begetting, the rearing, the education, and the moral training of successive generations of human beings. Marriage is willed by God and was raised to a sacrament by Christ. The Sacrament of Marriage celebrates the human capacity for love and total dedication, and serves as a witness to Christ's love for the Church. It involves all aspects of life: mental, physical and spiritual.

Marriage is viewed as an inseparable relationship by Catholics because sacramental marriage symbolizes Christ's union with the church, which serves as his mystical body. When a couple cooperates with God's movement in their lives and recognizes that Christ is living and acting in their relationship, attitudes, and actions, their lives become sacramental.

In most cases, the ceremony is performed during a mass, with a priest acting as both the ceremony's minister and a witness to the couple's consent. The marriage union is utilized to sanctify both the husband and wife by bringing them to a greater comprehension of God's love. It is also supposed to be productive, with any children to be raised in accordance with the teachings of the church.
