# The Mass Part four: The Concluding Rites – Commissioning . . . .

**The Procession:** The priest and deacon, just as they did when they entered the sanctuary at the beginning of Mass, kiss the altar once again as a sign of respect after the dismissal. The act of kissing the altar is done to show respect for the Lord's sacrifice on the cross, which is now made visible to us on the altar. A procession down the aisle with the altar servers follows their genuflection to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.

This procession serves to remind the congregation—as it does at the start of Mass—that the priest is the parish community's shepherd, walking alongside them through life's challenges and blessings. The faithful never leave the church until the altar servers and priest have done so because of respect for the priest who represents Christ the Good Shepherd and to keep the church in order and decorum.

**The Recessional Chant/Hymn:** In order for the faithful to fully participate in the celebration of Mass, they should never leave the church before the recessional chant or hymn has ended, even though it is not required. When it is sung, the recessional chant forms the final part of the Mass and accompanies the procession of the servers and the priest out of the church.

The entire significance of the ritual gestures of the Mass is only revealed to us in relation to our daily lives.
