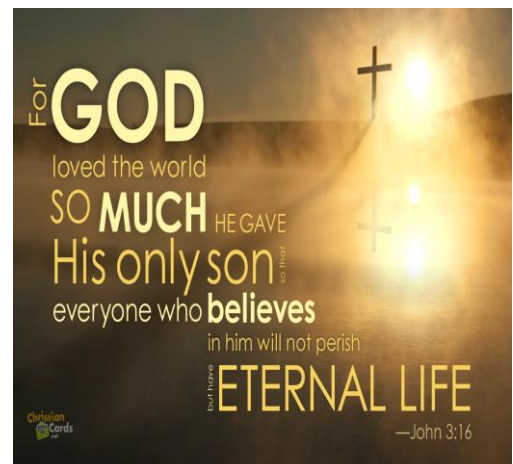

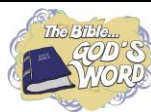

The week leading up to Easter Sunday is known as Holy Week, and it starts on Palm Sunday. The final day is Holy Saturday. Easter is the start of the Easter season in the liturgical year, not a part of Holy Week.

Palm Sunday - On this day, we commemorate the triumphal entry of Our Saviour, Jesus Christ, on a donkey into Jerusalem. On that day, the people presented Jesus with palms, an act usually reserved for victorious leaders. At Mass, we commemorate this by giving out palms to the faithful, who may keep them for a while to use as devotional items. During the Liturgy, the palms are blessed. Some of the faithful may carve crosses out of palm frond pieces. These palms eventually make their way back to the church to be burned. Historically, their ashes are kept and distributed at the Ash Wednesday rituals the following year.

Holy Thursday - Every Mass commemorates the Last Supper, but Holy Thursday is especially significant. Jesus climbed the Mount of Olives to pray after dinner. The Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration practice, in which we are invited to spend an hour in prayer with Jesus who is genuinely present in the Eucharist as His Body, Blood, and Divinity, is inspired by this event. It was Holy Thursday night when Jesus was taken into custody.

Good Friday - We remember Our Lord's trial, punishment, and crucifixion. Jesus was hauled before Annas that morning, who accused him of blasphemy. Jesus was then brought before Pilate for a trial. Despite the fact that Pilate discovered no evidence of Jesus' guilt, he consented to have him crucified in order to calm the mob and stop a riot. The Tabernacle is left vacant in our churches as a sign that Christ has gone.

Holy Saturday/Easter Vigil - Even though it is observed on Holy Saturday evening, Easter officially begins with the dramatic Easter vigil service. Attending this lovely service ought to be a priority for all Catholics. There are four sections to the vigil: Service of Light; Liturgy of the Word; Liturgy of Baptism; and, Liturgy of the Eucharist.

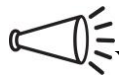
