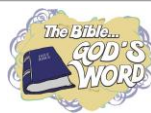
PASTOR'S CORNER

Sacrament of Confession

We all have the wonderful chance to repent of our faults and ask for forgiveness via the Sacrament of Confession, also known as Reconciliation or Penance. God cleanses us of our sins and pardons our errors in His unending mercy and love, enabling us to make amends with the Church and God. You can recognize your errors and purge your soul of sin by understanding the purpose of confession and its importance.

It's crucial to avoid viewing confession as a duty or something you must do. You should think of confession as a gift instead since it is a lovely sacrament and a manifestation of His mercy. It's also a chance for you to experience His love, develop, and deepen your faith. Confession aids in receiving God's grace and enables us to mend our ties with the Church and God. Instead of feeling compelled to confess or being afraid of punishment, people should confess because they love God and desire to mend their relationship with Him. Simply said, the purpose of confession requirements is to facilitate our search of a life more closely aligned with God and the road to eternal life.

How confession improves our quality of life is another crucial aspect to take into account. While many people, understandably, go to confession to receive forgiveness for the sins they are conscious of committing, confession can also teach us how to resist temptation and avoid sinning.

World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly - The fourth Sunday in July, in close proximity to the liturgical memory of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents, has been designated by Pope Francis as the official World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in the Church. The festival on July 24 this year will have the theme "In Old Age They Will Still Bear Fruit" (Ps. 92:15). The emphasis of the theme is on how grandparents are a blessing to the Church and society as a whole. Moreover this year, Pope Francis is offering a plenary indulgence to the faithful who devote adequate time to visiting their elderly relatives in need or in difficulty, either in person or virtually.
