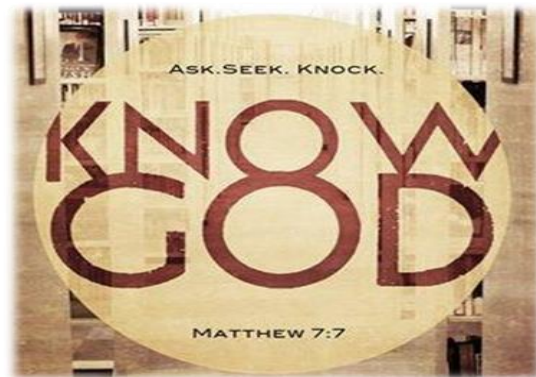

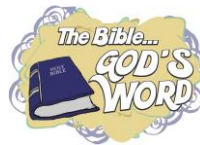

Third week: March 20-26

As we enter the third week of Lent, we can either cement the patterns we've started or start over if we haven't been able to do so yet.

Turn around ...

two simple words that can change a life in one moment.

Turn around ...

two simple words that invite us to retrace our steps and see what we may have missed.

Turn around ...

a call to change.

During Lent, we are called to repentance, a call to turn around. Just like dashing into our home for forgotten keys or turning around on the interstate when we get lost, repentance calls us to seek something lost and reorient ourselves to get back on track.

A person must be willing and humble to admit he has lost his way and seek to change. We all have something for which we need to repent: a wrong we have committed, a good we have neglected to do, a harsh or unkind statement we have made. The call comes in the midst of conflict, gently whispering in our ear that we need to turn around. We have sometimes been less than lovely, less than faithful and less than gracious with other people and with ourselves. Rather than holding on to habits and practices that aren't serving you, let them go. Make a conscious choice to follow the path of goodness and love, service and truth. Listen to the still, small voice within you and turn around without guilt.

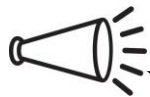
