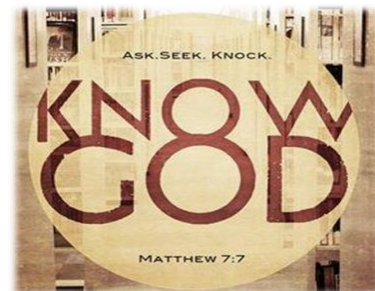

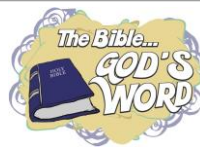

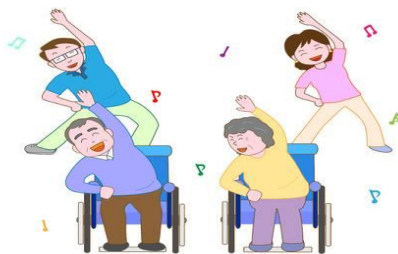
A CRUCIFIX?

It serves as a reminder of how much Jesus loved us and an encouragement to love him back. The crucifix should be readily visible in the sanctuary near the altar. Our faith revolves around a person named Jesus Christ, who is both God and Man. Jesus loves us and invites us to love Him back, and that love is expressed through prayer and worship, as well as service to our neighbor. The first and second commandments are similar: love God above all else and love your neighbor as yourself.

A SACRISTY?

Many members of the congregation never see the sacristy, which is located next to or behind the sanctuary. The sacristy is where the priest prepares for Mass, including closets for vestments, shelves for liturgical ornaments (candles, thuribles, cruets, bells, bread, wine, and so on), and a safe for the sacred vessels (chalice, ciborium, and monstrance). A dedicated sink for washing and polishing sacred items, a sacrarium, is frequently seen in the sacristy. A sacrarium is a sink that empties directly into the ground and is used solely for washing sacred items and linens.

Stiff joints? Loosen them up with chair exercises on Wednesdays at noon via Zoom. See Daphne Hicks or use the contact form on the church's website for more information.

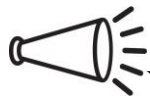
