On September 27, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, who knew that “God had sent him to bring good news to the poor.” *Together with your gifts, the members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul continue his work and mission in our parish.*

The Mass - Part one: Gathering rites. . . .

Gathering: Our Sunday service is centered on gathering, on coming together. This word, gathering, describes the purpose behind each of the ceremonial actions performed throughout the first section of the Mass. These rituals are meant to unite us into a single body that is prepared to listen and share a meal.

Greeters/Ushers: We all prefer to be met and welcomed when we gather for a celebration, therefore in many churches today, there will be someone at the entrance to welcome you as you arrive for Sunday Mass. We welcome guests into our home and say hello when they arrive for a meal or a party.

Use of Water: When we Catholics arrive to church, one of the first things we do is make the sign of the cross with our right hand after dipping it in water. This ceremony serves as a reminder of our baptism. Every Mass, we make a fresh commitment to put sin to death.

Genuflection: Before a king or other person of authority, it was customary in medieval Europe to genuflect (fall to one knee). Gradually, this outward sign of respect made its way into the Church, and people started bowing before the altar and the presence of Christ in the tabernacle before sitting down. Many people nowadays still follow an even more ancient tradition and bow before taking their seats to show their respect.

Posture, song: Everybody stands up when the Mass begins. Standing during prayer is the standard position for Christians; it shows that we are attentive to God's word and that we are ready to put it into practice. Often, we start by singing together.

Procession: The priest must at least enter the sanctuary in a procession before the Mass can officially begin. The assembly is represented by the priest, and everyone with him travels as a representation of the Christian's journey through life to the heavenly courts. A crucifix is frequently carried by one of the servers (a crucifer), who represents Jesus as our "guide to salvation," in the front of the procession.
